

# Seal the deals

t felt fitting this week to bring you Escape's roundup of the 50 biggest travel deals right now as the world is, quite literally, on sale. As news continues to emerge - Singapore is now open to vaccinated Australians, and Hawaii and Thailand, too – and as our deals expert, Mercedes Maguire, discovered, there are some unmissable packages and discounts to be had both here and abroad.

Even if you're not ready to travel overseas just yet, the benefits of booking ahead are appealing, particularly at some of the current rates. Travel agents, accommodation suppliers, airlines and cruise operators are joining the party, and the last piece of the puzzle (other than our westernmost state) is for cruising in Australia to get the green light. With high interest and bookings for cruising at pre-pandemic levels, it's clear devoted passengers are more than ready to set sail.

It's certainly a satisfying moment. While there's a long road ahead for the travel industry, the intensity and demand so far has been positive and heartening. Travel agents have never been more in need - we're all seeking the security and reassurance of that professional, expert helping hand. While, unsurprisingly, Fiji has registered an immediate uplift in interest (a recent front page of The Fiji Times quoted 40,000 visitors expected in two months), I wasn't expecting Bali to have triggered such avid interest - Virgin reported an increase in bookings of more than 273 per cent in the past two weeks for the Sydney to Denpasar route. It seems nothing will hold a good Aussie back from a suite in Seminyak or a Bintang on a beanbag at Canggu.

Tour operators or agents such as Ignite have also seen record interest in places such as Fiji, Hawaii and Thailand (searches in October were up across these destinations by 2000 per cent) as well as London (London is also currently one of our top search terms on escape.com.au), and above average bookings on European river cruises, with younger passengers the fastest-growing category.

It makes sense - river cruises are intimate, and with a smaller number of guests on the ship, it feels safer and less intimidating. They also make life wonderfully easy - no navigating various airports or customs in different countries and multiple tests and confusion. Travel the world via a floating home, wake up in a new place, and get pampered while you're at it. After the year we've had, the less  $complicated \, our journey, the \, better. \,$


#### Italy via Woolloomooloo
